Senate Joint Resolution 52

We worked with Senator Danny Carroll on SJR 152.

- Unanimously passed by KY Senate and House Education Committees
- Became law April 10, 2018
- Notes that the KY General Assembly "envisages all local school districts in the Commonwealth implementing Peer Supports and Peer Networks to identify and equip groups of peers to provide ongoing support to individuals with significant disabilities in or outside of the classroom"
- Directs the KY Department of Education to partner with the Human Development Institute (HDI), University of Kentucky, and the College of Education and Human Development, University of Louisville, to implement the project in public schools across the Commonwealth.

All Students Benefit

While peer partners rated the academic and social benefits gained by their peers with significant disabilities very highly (over a '4' on a '5' point scale), peers rated the academic and social benefits that they themselves received from peer support arrangements even higher!
